Committees

Each of the following committees, with the leadership of its chair, and under the guidance of the Altar and Rosary Society president and parish priest, fulfills the duties required to meet the increasing demands of our parish.



Altar Committee

This committee is responsible for maintaining altar linens, vestments and supplies. This includes making, mending, laundering and ironing vestments. It also includes learning the proper techniques for handling, washing, folding and storing sacred linens and supplies, and ordering and purchasing supplies.

Flower Committee



This committee is responsible for obtaining, purchasing and maintaining fresh flowers on the altar or in the church according to liturgical custom and as requested by the parish priest. This includes weekly and special Masses, Easter, Christmas decorations, and all church functions and special occasions.



Ceremonial/Special Event Committee

This committee is responsible for coordinating and organizing special ceremonies and functions of the church, such as, May Crowning, First Communion and Confirmation, and the preparation of food as necessary. The chairman of this committee is the President unless otherwise appointed.

Cleaning Committee



All Active members of A&R are encouraged to participate on this committee, as are all women of the parish. Committee members are divided into at least 8 rotating teams that undertake the weekly cleaning of the entire church building (vestibule, church nave, transepts, baptistery, confessionals, altar, sacristy, basement, kitchen, and common areas).

Fundraising Committee



The Fundraising Committee is responsible for organizing fundraising events throughout the year in order to purchase the various supplies needed by the church (vestments, altar supplies, bathroom and kitchen supplies).



Social/Welcoming Committee

This committe is responsible for welcoming newcomers to our parish, and the sending of occasional cards as appropriate. This committee handles arrangements for visiting priests and dignitaries, including meals when necessary, and for keeping parishioners informed and educated about the proper etiquette in meeting or hosting members of the church hierarchy.
